AOLS SALARY SURVEY 2023

Process and Definitions

Process

- The survey was sent to all Ontario Land Surveyors and Articling Students.
- Participants were encouraged to share the link to the survey with support staff (field and office).
- No identifying information was collected.
- All data was included except where noted.
- Numbers from different views of the data will not match since not all participants answered all of the questions.
- Some responses were interpreted. For instance, when asked for salary details, a response of 100 was assumed to mean \$100,000, not \$100.
- Some responses were undecipherable and were not included. For instance, when asked for salary details, a response of 3215 was ignored.
- Hourly rate amounts were translated to annual salary amounts assuming a 40 hr work week.

Definitions

- Median is the middle value of a response field.
- High Mean is the average value of all responses above the Median.
- Low Mean is the average value of all responses below the Median.

Other Notes

- The survey was sent out in 2023 and the information displayed represent 2022 values.
- The survey did not specify between full-time and part-time salary. As a result, values may not reflect strictly full-time salaries.

Summary of Respondents

- 224 responses were received from licensed and registered members out of a possible 498 (45 % response rate).
- 28 responses were received from articling students of a possible 89 (31 % response rate).
- 80 responses were received from support staff.
